
We invite you to give a presentation at our **STUDENT SPOTLIGHT** event on Wednesday, March 27, 2019.

## Guidelines to Students

### **Abstract:**

Your abstract should be no more than 300 words. Please include your name, affiliation, and contact information. Provide a short, but clear title. The body of your abstract should include a clear statement of topic and describe briefly how your research was/is being undertaken, results to-date, value of your findings and conclusion.

The committee will review all abstracts for quality and relevance to SETAC and will notify all who apply if their abstract is accepted. For more information about SETAC, see our websites for SETAC North America and Laurentian SETAC.

### **Presentation:**

If your abstract is accepted by the committee, your presentation should be 10mins in length. All slides should be eligible by the audience (no slides where you have to say “I know that you can’t see this but.....”). An additional 5 minutes will be provided for questions.

### **Judging:**

Your presentation will be evaluated by volunteer judges based on clarity, relevance, length, among other criteria. The winning student will receive a voucher for a free meal at a future Ottawa Pub night.
